



Tell Gov. DeWine: Moratorium now on fracking Ohio public lands!

On January 2, a Gulfport well pad less than six miles from Salt Fork State Park exploded. The fire burned for 18 hours. Roads were closed, and nearby homes had to be evacuated.

What if this had happened at a well pad next to the park? How would people be evacuated? What would it do to the air, land, and water?

Thirty groups led by Save Ohio Parks sent a letter asking Gov. Mike DeWine to declare a moratorium on any new or pending nominations, bids, and leases to frack public land. Here's why:

- Ohio remains unprepared for a major accident.
- Chemicals in the industry are dangerous and unregulated.
- Ohio has had almost 2,000 oil and gas incidents in eight years.
- Ohio engages in poor waste management practices.
- Ohio has not studied the health impacts of oil and gas production.
- Ohio cannot guarantee tourists and residents will be safe.
